It is much cheaper to alter your work plan in advance than after the work is completed. Each year, some very expensive work has to be reversed because it does not comply with community standards.

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Preparing for Winter

As you winterize your homes and lawns, please remember these helpful tips:

- 1) Clear any leaves from gutters, curbs, and storm drains to minimize buildup from heavy rains and snow melt.
- 2) During heavy snow storms, please park all vehicles on the **odd-numbered** side of the street to give the plows maximum room to clear.
- Prepare an emergency kit for your car to include rock salt, sand, clothing, blankets, flashlight/batteries, and food/water should you get stranded.
- 4) Be sure your vehicle is in good working order.
- 5) Look out for the dangers from carbon monoxide poisoning.

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Let it Snow, Let it Snow, Let it Snow

In applying some lessons learned from the 2009 & 2010 major snow storms, the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) has made changes to their snow removal plans.

Early deployment to subdivisions: Salt/sand trucks will be pre-positioned in subdivisions whenever the forecast calls for two or more inches. Each subdivision will have at least one dedicated truck, with the intent of assigning the same driver to that subdivision throughout the winter.

Updated snowplow assignment maps: Each of the 650 snow maps in northern Virginia has been updated. These maps show hotspots, boundary lines, school, police stations, hospitals, and bus stops.

VDOT is responsible for 17,679 lane miles in Fairfax, Loudoun, Prince William, and Arlington counties. About half are local or neighborhood streets.

What can you do the help?

When the forecast calls for snow, make every effort to park in your garage or driveway. If not feasible, VDOT requests parking on the odd numbered side of the street. This will make the most road surface available for the trucks to not only plow a path, but work on clearing curb to curb.

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Spring Construction - Submit your Applications Early!

Although it is hard to believe that it will be Spring again in a few short months, many of our neighbors are already planning their next exterior home improvements. If you are one of these, please make sure to take a look at the Architectural Guidelines and submit any applications with enough lead time. The review board meets monthly, so you do not want to have to halt your projects to wait for HOA approvals. Or worse redo the project if it does not meet the guidelines. And please remember, the board is all volunteer, so there is no expediting process.

Some common areas where owners have run into trouble are:

Rear fencing that gets installed to the front of the corners of the home, instead of being installed on either the rear corner or halfway up the side;

Fences that do not follow the property line, or the wrong type of material for a fence; Sheds that are oversized, improperly placed, not matching the color of the house, and are made of non-conforming materials.

The goal of the Guidelines are to assure all homeowners that the character and appeal of the whole neighborhood will be maintained. This, in turn, protects property values and enhances the community's overall environment. Many times, when an application can not be approved, your neighbors on the Architectural Review Board can provide guidance and alternative that may even better suit the owner's needs.

The Armfield Farm HOA Board and Capitol Property Management Company are committed to ensuring that residents remain compliant with the guidelines set forth in the association's Architectural Design and Maintenance Standards. If/when compliance is not followed, applicable penalties will be applied to homeowners and renters who violate the guidelines.
