Finally, a special thanks to Kay Shear for heading the Social Committee for the last several years. The great events she helped organize with the Social Committee will be a tough act to follow.


Neighborhood Safety

It's OK to be ODD -Help out the snow plows by parking on the odd-side of the street during winter weather.



Water Line Insurance

In the last quarter, another two neighbors met with the unexpected issue of having the water line that goes from the street to their house fail. Did you know that the line is the homeowner's responsibility? Repairs can run in excess of \$6,000. Homeowners insurance is unlikely to cover this expense. However, Dominion Power does have a separate insurance that you can add to your bill for just a few dollars a month. To contact them, call 866-DOM-HELP.



Gas Mantles

As daylight is still limited, it's important to check that your lamp posts are functioning correctly. In a recent walk through, 32 homes had lamps that were dark. Our ARB guidelines require them both to be lit or the light be converted to electricity with a sensor to turn it on automatically at night. In order to help residents obtain the mantles, we have purchased a stock of them and our management company will resell them at cost. Please bring a check to Capitol Property Management at 3914 Centreville Road made out to Armfield Farm HOA for \$6.00 as they do not accept cash or credit cards at the office. They are open Monday - Friday 9:00am to 5:00pm or call ahead to 703-707-6404.



Armfield Farm History

Our local area of Northern Virginia is full of history dating back from colonial times to the Civil War to the construction of Dulles Airport. Last year, the Board decided to take a look at the history of the land our homes sit on, already with some interesting results.

- Our properties were part of a 4,000 acre patent of land covering Flat Lick Run (today known as Flatlick Branch of Cub Run, the stream that runs under Lees Corner Road by the elementary school) issued by Thomas Lord Fairfax to Captain George Turberville in 1727.
- After several divisions and inheritances, over 1,500 acres north of the Little River Turnpike (present day Lee Jackson Memorial Highway) was allocated to Cornelia Lee Turberville in 1817. She, with her husband, Charles Calvert Stuart, later built the original Chantilly Mansion which includes the stone tenement house on the International Country Club grounds.
- John Bynum (J.B.) Armfield purchased the 154 acres that includes our community on June 1, 1914 for \$4,312, a mortgage he paid off in four years.
- J.B. Armfield was born in Surry County, NC on January 12, 1872 and died January 25, 1964 at the age of 92. With his wife, Dora Speas, they raised three children (Elizabeth, J. Bynum, and Mary) and one granddaughter on the farm. J.B. was known as a prominent dairy farmer, often cited for his productive herd.
- Elizabeth married Paul Bokel in 1937 and Mary married Carroll Leith in 1947, giving us the basis for two of our street names.
- J. Bynum was involved in Democratic politics in the 1940s and buying supplies for WWII. He was manager for the Town of Herndon from 1948-1949. During the 1950s, it appears he moved to Richmond and was working for as an accountant

- J.B., Dora, and Elizabeth are buried in adjoining plots at Chestnut Grove Cemetery in Herndon.
- The farm was sold for development in 1973.



We remind homeowners & renters that any <u>architectural and/or exterior changes re-</u> <u>quire an application and approval.</u> To gain approval for changes, submit an application to the Architectural Review Board (ARB) using the *Armfield Farm Homeowners Association Exterior Alternations Application* (related changes can be included on the same form).



The Armfield Farm HOA Board and Capitol Property Management Company are committed to ensuring that residents remain compliant with the guidelines set forth in the association's Architectural Design and Maintenance Standards. If/when compliance is not followed, applicable penalties will be applied to homeowners and renters who violate the guidelines.
