NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

Welcome to anyone who is new and, of course, to all of you who take the time to read our Newsletter to see what is going on in our neighborhood!



The speed limit in our neighborhood is 25 m.p.h., not 45 or faster. Too many of us drive too fast through our streets. A word of warning: when you get your speeding ticket for driving too fast, don't be surprised. Many of our kids play in the streets and especially dangerous is playing in the street near a busy intersection.

I am very pleased to say we have had mostly a quiet month, but I do want to make everyone aware of a certain incident. A neighbor who has a deck found someone had pushed or kicked in the lattice portion of a locked doorway under the deck. The person may have wanted to see what was stored under the deck or to gain entry into the house through basement windows. Fortunately, the basement windows were secure (Alarm System). This happened during the daytime and there was nothing taken.

NOISE AND LIGHT DEVICES HOME PROTECTION

- A Driveway Alert System is a motion sensor that lets you know if anyone is approaching your home. It detects the heat

and motion of approaching visitors up to 40' away and sends a signal to a receiver inside the house, which activates a four second buzzer. You can plug the receiver into any household outlet.

- It looks like a Radio, but Sounds can analyze noises in your home and detect those noises that sound like forced entry (breaking glass and splintering wood). It monitors up to 2,500 square feet and wails when activated for 10 minutes.
- Alarm Screens look like high quality fiberglass window screens, but once you plug them in, they activate an alarm when tampered with from the outside.

If you have questions, comments or issues to raise, please bring them to the attention of the Pool and Tennis Committee members. SUPER SOAKERS made their debut and raised a controversy the 1st day the pool opened. Parents, please make sure your children know that Super Soakers are NOT allowed at all in the baby pool; their use in the rest of the pool grounds is at the discretion of the lifeguards at all times. Also, please check that any children over 6 years old do not use the baby pool. We all want our little ones to be able to play safely and happily in their little pool. The lifeguards do not guard the baby pool so, parents, it's up to you to keep it safe.

LIFEGUARDS - Generally speaking, as far as safety is concerned, we encourage anyone to bring their concerns over safety at the pool to a lifeguard if it is of an immediate nature or to any of the Pool Committee otherwise.

BIKES - Parents with strollers are having a hard time getting through bikes parked all over the sidewalk. Please remind your children to park their bikes next to or in the bike rack.

PARTIES - The pool is available for private parties. Please keep several things in mind to help your party and the regular use of the pool be a success. If your party involves non-member guests, notify the guards in writing and reserve your date and time on the calendar in front of the guard desk. In case of conflicts, the Pool Committee will use its discretion. Make your payment for the non-member guests in advance by check. Remember too that your unused guest passes accumulate from year to year.

TENNIS PLAYERS have requested a backboard for practice. The Board will review this request at the June meeting, for Budgetary and other considerations.

Our appreciation to all the parents who have been helping. We thank you and look forward to your continued support.


Neighbors - It is time for our
