

Think Before You Text

The Fairfax County Police Department urges motorists to pay full time and attention when driving and reminds them that House Bill 1876 goes into effect on Wednesday, July 1. The new law prohibits drivers from sending or reading text messages and is punishable by a fine of \$20.00 for the first offense and \$50.00 for additional infractions. Virginia is the ninth state in the nation to ban text messaging while driving.

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Electric Sundays at the I-66 Transfer Station

Fairfax County residents can recycle televisions, computers and electronic peripherals at the I-66 Transfer Station from 10 a.m. - 3 p.m. at upcoming Electric Sunday events. The Transfer Station is located at 4618 West Ox Road in Fairfax. There is no cost to Fairfax County residents for this service. This event is sponsored in part by Covanta Fairfax, LLC.

Electric Sundays are limited to the collection of central processing units (CPU), computer monitors, computer peripherals, laptops, desktop computers, televisions, console TVs, projector TVs, flatscreen TVs, consumer electronics containing circuit boards, stereos, video cassette recorders, CD/DVD players, telephones, cell phones, printers, scanners, copiers, fax machines, computer parts and accessories, keyboards and mice. Equipment brought to these events **does not** need to be in working order.

Home Depot is accepting compact fluorescent light bulbs for recycling, free of charge. Take the unbroken, expired bulbs to the returns desk of any store. CF light bulbs will also be accepted for recycling on September 12th at Navy FCU at 820 Follin Lane, Vienna from 9am to 2pm and on September 19th at the Sully District Government Center (4900 Stonecroft Blvd, Chantilly) from 9am to 2pm. 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Please be a Good Neighbor - From the President

It has been a very rainy start to the summer this year. While we are certainly beginning to tire of it, the lawns in our neighborhood are very happy. Overall, most homeowners are doing a great job keeping their lawns at a reasonable length.

Please be sure to remove the weeds from your flowerbeds and use the weed-whacker around posts. A good-looking lawn can really be brought down by a small section of 12-inch weeds or grass.

Unfortunately, the HOA has recently been getting a number of complaints about people who either store their trashcans on the side of their home or put their grass/yard debris out too early. Please do NOT place your trash bags with grass in them at the curb before Tuesday at 6:00pm. Many people are placing them at the curb right after they mow the lawn on the weekend.

The prevalence of these bags really brings down the look of our neighborhood and affects everyone's home value. The Homeowners Association will be sending out violation notices on this issue and repeat offenders may be assessed a charge of \$50 per incident. We really hope we do not have to assess any charges.

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Water Line & Sump Pump Notices

Did you know that the water line that runs from the street to your home is your responsibility? We have had a number of people in our community who have needed to get this line replaced during the past year. Dominion Virginia Power has an insurance plan you can add to your power bill for about \$3 per month to cover this risk that could cost you as much as \$4,500.

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HOA Annual Meeting Highlights

On May 28th Armfield Farms held the annual Homeowners meeting at Franklin Middle School. Michael Frey, Sully District Supervisor, spoke about the reduction in County road repairs for 2009, cutbacks on median mowing, the widening of Route 50 west of Route 28, and about other community concerns.

Vice-President Steve Snyder and Secretary Greg Seiler were successfully re-elected. Thank you to all of the members that voted through the proxy and a special thank you to all the in-person attendees.

A petition for re-zoning our neighborhood streets as a Community Parking District was passed around and discussed. Hopefully you have been contacted by one or more of the community members about signing the petition. UPDATE: in recent news, Fairfax County is considering making all residential streets Community Parking zones restricting vehicles over 12,000 pounds.
