For those who weren't able to attend the HOA Annual Meeting on May 24th, here are some of the important pieces of information you missed:

Our keynote guest speaker, State Senator Janet Howell who represents the Reston area district in the General Assembly, reported on a number of issues:

- Howell noted that 40% of her district (including Armfield Farm) are new constituents as a result of redistricting after the 2010 Census.
- The recent session was very unusual, starting off-track and ending off-track.
 Due to a 20-20 split between the politi-



Shed Guidelines Updated

In the June Board of Directors meeting, an update to the Architectural Design and Maintenance Standards was approved regarding storage sheds. A new size limit was put in place to accommodate those houses that do not have a garage and provides specific guidance on height, length, and width limits for the shed walls.



Any storage shed has an aesthetic impact on neighbors. Inconsiderately placed or poorly designed sheds can visually and functionally negate an otherwise desirable residential area. Therefore, it is important to remember when choosing and locating a shed there are needs other than storage that must be considered.

All storage sheds need to have an application submitted to and approved by the Architectural Review Board before construction begins. Most common pitfalls include requesting sheds that are oversized or requesting to place the shed on property not owned by the homeowner. For these reasons, applications should have appropriate plats and drawings.

The new Guidelines will be posted on the website soon and are available in the interim from president@armfieldfarm.org.

cal parties, there was great difficulty in sharing power between the committees where most of the work gets done.

- As such, the state suffered embarrassments with gun control, voter identification, and abortion legislation that made national news and late night comedy shows.
- Sen. Howell fielded questions for residents concerning transportation funding, school calendar, taxation, and standardized testing.

Pool rules are now available on the website. Raft night is back by popular demand on Thursdays from 6pm-8pm.

This was the first year the HOA used electronic voting, with 54 households taking advantage of the new service. Next year the voter code will be on the letter and not the envelope and it may be used as a survey tool for future questions.

The walking paths will be repaved in sections, with the first portion along Lees Corner

from Springhaven to Roger Mack being done this summer. More will be completed in 2013 and 2014, but prices have significantly increased since the paths were first put in.


As mentioned in the last issue, two tot lots were installed near Springhaven. A plan for increasing shade is being considered. The basketball court near Springhaven is tentatively scheduled for resurfacing shortly. The two courts behind 3628 Beech Down are being budgeted for next year.

Keeping a Watchful Eye

As the temperature increases, so frequently does crime. This hit home for one resident of the 3800 block of Beech Down Drive in particular in June. Fortunately only property was taken—no humans were at home and no pets were injured. It serves as a good reminder to lock your doors, arm your alarm systems if you have them, and be attentive



to anyone who approaches your door as they may be looking to see if someone is home.

Some residents have called for the recreation of a neighborhood watch program. The HOA sponsored one some years ago, but participation fell off and the effort was discontinued. If you are interested in serving on a watch, please contact our property manager, Dan Gordon at 703-707-6404.

If you see something going on in the neighborhood that just doesn't look right, make use of the Fair Oaks Police District non-emergency number, 703-691-2131. One tip may be all it takes to crack the case.

Pick A Number, Any Number

In February, Commonwealth Transportation Board approved a designation transfer of three major Northern Virginia roads into primary roads, meaning they may be eligible for new funding and maintenance priorities. The routes will be able to receive federal funding for paving, guardrail and bridge improvements, along with other projects. The feds typically cover 80 percent of the cost to maintain interstates and primary roads. The state would pay the remaining 20 percent.

The change means the Fairfax County Park-



way/Route 7100 will be renamed Route 286. The Virginia Department of Transportation will put up signs that call the road "Old Route 7100."

The 32-mile Fairfax County Parkway runs from Route 1 to Route 7 and carries between 22,000 and 75,000 vehicles per day.

The signs will be replaced over the next three months. VDOT says drivers will see the old route number alongside the new route number for about a year in order for hotels, businesses and map companies to have enough time to update their materials.

It is with regret that we share that former HOA Vice President and long time resident Dennis Kazuba died on March 28th in South Carolina. He was 67. Dennis worked as a physical education teacher who spent much of his career at Greenbriar East Elementary School in Chantilly before retiring in 1996. In after-school programs, he coached gymnastics at Greenbriar East and swimming at Chantilly High School. He also coached his children's softball and basketball leagues. In addition to his teaching work, he was a driving instructor and disc jockey under the name of DJ Kaz. He will be missed.



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Water Line Insurance

In June, one of our neighbors met with the unexpected issue of having the water line that goes from the street to his house fail. Did you know that the line is the homeowner's responsibility? Repairs can run in excess of \$6,000. Homeowners insurance is unlikely to cover this expense. However, Dominion Power does have a separate insurance that you can add to your bill for just a few dollars a month. To contact them, call 1-866-DOM-HELP.

Curb Your Yard Waste



Keep those bags out of sight 'til TUESDAY

night


In June, new sign boards were put up at the community entrances to remind residents of the regulation that yard waste must be kept out of view from the street until the night before pick up. Already in the first two weeks, violations dropped in half from 31 to 16. While it may be more personally convenient to leave your bags on the street for up to six days, it limits parking, impacts mail/package delivery, and is unsightly. Thank you to all residents who have and are now following our ARB guidelines. It is a big help to insuring increased property values and the attractiveness of the community to potential new residents.

Please note that enforcement was temporarily suspended for storm clean up.

Traffic Calming

Late last year, a traffic study was conducted by Fairfax County's Department of Transportation to look at the intersection of Beech Down and Springhaven. The study concluded that the intersection could be eligible for a four-way stop sign due to the excessive speed on the road. 15% of traffic is travelling at or greater than 35 miles per hour (10 miles per hour over the speed limit).

In order for the County Board of Supervisors to approve any new traffic calming device, a petition must be submitted from the affected area, or in this case 70 houses from Springhaven, Beech Down, Malin, Hampstead, and Armfield Farm. Additionally, a community meeting may be held to gather resident input and address any concerns in the affected area. To learn more, contact Galileo at vicepresident@armfieldfarm.org.
