A number of capital projects are moving along this summer. We replaced the roof on the well at the entrance to Bokel Drive, installed new mulch at the Clary Sage playground, resealed the pool parking lot and removed the old tot-lot near Kew Garden

Court. We are still waiting on permits from the County to install the new shade structure at the pool. We are also waiting on a final design for the new entrance sign at Lees Corner Road and Springhaven Drive. We hope to have both of these projects done soon. In addition to these projects we plan to install soccer goals on the Clary Sage field and are considering adding sand and/or rebuilding the volleyball courts by the pool. Annual Meeting Recap

For those who weren't able to attend the HOA Annual Meeting on May 24th, here are some of the important pieces of information you missed:

Our keynote guest speaker, State Delegate Tom Rust who represents the Herndon/Chantilly area district in the General Assembly, reviewed the 2014 session specifically highlighting transportation and budget topics of interest.

Virginia Congressional Primary

On April 26th, the Republican Party held a firehouse primary (a primary election run by the party at limited polling locations) to select their nominee for the 10th US Congressional District seat being vacated by Rep. Frank Wolf. Centreville High School hosted the balloting for the Sully and Springfield area precincts (including Armfield Farm). Virginia Delegate Barbara Comstock won the primary and will face off against Fairfax County Supervisor John Foust (who was the Democratic Party nominee without contest) in November, along with possible other challengers. The results from Centreville were:


