Assisted Care Facility

In a follow up to our Spring 2014 article, the Arbors of Chantilly, a proposed assisted/ memory care facility sent notices through their engineer about upcoming construction in the vicinity of Route 50 and Downs Drive. The HOA Board has been actively monitoring this project through the developer, the Sully District Council of Citizens Associations, and the Fairfax Board of Supervisors. The construction should not cause any logistical concerns and noise is unlikely to be significant. It is possible that the most western edge of Leith Court will hear some activity, but the number of trees between them and the construction site should absorb most noise.

Capital Improvements in Armfield Farm




Letter from Delegate Tom Rust on Road Paving

As you recall, VDOT was not able to fulfill its commitment to repave the roads in Armfield Farm subdivision in 2014 due to excessive costs of removing snow due in the winter of 2014, among other things. I met with VDOT representatives last fall and explained that the roads in Armfield Farm were my highest priority because of the overall deterioration. I am pleased to inform you these roads have been added to the tentative paving schedule for 2015. The roads which are included in the list: Armfield



Farm Drive, Clary Sage Drive, Angelica Court, Old Chatwood Place, Gladwyn Court, Haverford Court, Kew Garden Court, Hampstead Court, Beech Down Drive, Windmoore Court, Rosetree Court, Brockmeyer Court, Southernwood Court, Paoli Court, Springhaven Drive, Malin Court, Bellerose Drive, Dittany Court, Bromall Court, King Charles Drive, Chevy Chase Court, Carroll Court and Lees Corner Road.

VDOT cannot give me an exact timeframe when these streets will be repaved in 2015 because the contracts
are written such that the contractor
chooses his order of routes and VDOT
does not dictate the order. The order of
routes to be paved is normally based on
what is most efficient to the contractor. This method of contracting allows
VDOT to get the best price and enables
them to pave more routes for the citizens they serve. In the interim, should
you notice potholes, please do not hesi-



tate to contact either myself or VDOT to report the pothole.

As you know, this will be my final year serving as your delegate in the Virginia General Assembly; it has been an honor and a privilege to serve...Please keep in touch and thanks for your service to the community.

Tree Pruning

There are a number of neighbors doing tree work this year. To encourage the development of a strong, healthy tree, consider the following guidelines when pruning.

General:

- Prune first for safety, next for health, and finally for aesthetics.
- Avoid pruning trees when you might increase susceptibility to important pests (e.g., in areas where oak wilt exists, avoid pruning oaks in the spring and early summer; prune trees susceptible to fireblight only during the dormant season).
- Use the following decision guide for size of branches to be removed: 1) under 5cm diameter - go ahead, 2) between 5 and 10cm diameter - think twice, and 3) greater than 10cm diameter - have a good reason.

Crown Thinning:

- Assess how a tree will be pruned from the top down.
- Favor branches with strong, U-shaped angles of attachment. Remove branches with weak, V-shaped angles of attachment and/or included bark.
- Ideally, lateral branches should be evenly spaced on the main stem of young trees.
- Remove any branches that rub or cross another branch.
- Make sure that lateral branches are no more than onehalf to three-quarters of the diameter of the stem to discourage the development of co-dominant stems.
- Do not remove more than one-quarter of the living crown of a tree at one time. If it is necessary to remove more, do it over successive years.

Crown Raising:

- Always maintain live branches on at least two-thirds of a tree's total height. Removing too
 many lower branches will hinder the development of a strong stem.
- Remove basal sprouts and vigorous epicormic sprouts.

Crown Reduction:

- Use crown reduction pruning only when absolutely necessary. Make the pruning cut at a lateral branch that is at least one-third the diameter of the stem to be removed.
- If it is necessary to remove more than half of the foliage from a branch, remove the entire branch.
