
## **Community Yard Sale - June 7th**



## **Area Development**

There are four significant area development projects that the Board of Directors have been monitoring or been actively participating in getting information to share with the community.

As you have likely seen, the Dulles Discovery office complex and Discovery Square mixed commercial/residential space along Centreville Road are in full swing. The third building of the office complex is expected to start being populated over the summer with the new tenants. Developers anticipate that most traffic will use Route 28, but there will inevitably be some impact to Centreville Road. The residential and retail spaces are starting to take form with townhomes, multi-family units, and shopping. Along Air and Space Museum Parkway, there is expected to be a Primrose daycare, Chik-fil-A, Wawa gas station, and bank.

At the January meeting, the Board of Directors were briefed by the developers for The Arbors of Chantilly, a proposed Alzheimer's disease focused assisted living facility to be built on Route 50 at Downs Drive. Construction noise is not expected to be significant, but may mini-

## **Armfield Centennial Celebration**

Armfield Farm traces its routes to June 1, 1914, when John Bynum Armfield bought 154 acres of farm land in sparsely developed western Fairfax County. Things were quite a bit different from the suburbia of Washington that we see today. Route 50 was named Little River Turnpike—the name didn't change until the 1930s. Dulles Airport was still 40 years away from being designed. And instead of 470 houses making up the community, replace them with a herd of dairy cows. Over the past year, the Board of Directors have been researching the history of the Armfield family and our land. We've traced back title to the original patents from Thomas Lord Fairfax in the 1700s to when J.B.'s children sold the land in 1973 to development. Thanks to support from local historians, librarians, and court record clerks, we now have a written history to share with all of our residents.

On Sunday, June 1, 2014 at 2pm, the Board of Directors will dedicate a monument and host a party to honor this anniversary and the Armfield family at the community pool house. More details will be posted on the HOA website and announced at the Annual Meeting.

mally affect the residents on the most southwestern end of Leith Court. Additional details are posted on the armfieldfarm.org website.

Closer to home, expect that there will be work starting on the cell phone tower along Lees Corner Road between Bellerose and Springhaven Drives. AT&T is expanding their footprint at the existing site to the rear of the current equipment. In favorable news, this will result in additional revenue for capital improvements.

Also, the County has advised that they will start work on the retention pond on Beech Down near Bellerose Drives shortly, though not more specific. The updated plans are on the armfieldfarm.org website.

## **Architectural Review Board Guidance**

Very few people like to be told 'no' when they are designing a project for their own house, but even fewer like to be told 'no' after construction has already begun. Unfortunately, some owner choices in the past year have left them in violation of the community guidelines and having to take additional steps out of pocket to correct the problem. The ARB has seen a few concerns more frequently than others.

- 1) If the work is going to change the outside look of your house, an application is needed. This includes changes of color for siding, garage doors, and trim. Most violations result from perfectly approvable changes that never were requested. These requests stay in your ownership file and can be helpful in documenting what was done should you sell your property.
- 2) Storage Sheds. There is a limit of 80 square feet of surface area and no more than seven feet tall. It should aesthetically blend in with the house and though it should be obvious, sheds can only be installed on the owner's property.
- 3) Driveways. If you have a one car garage and a one car apron, your driveway should not be able to park two cars side by side.
- 4) Trash Cans. With multiple service providers, there seems to be a can on the street every day, however when not in use, cans need to be stored out of sight. In front of your garage or along a visible side of the house is not permitted. Recurrent violators may face a hearing.

## CAPITOL PROPERTY MANAGEMENT Armfield Farm Homeowners Association

The Armfield Farm Homeowners Association (HOA) Architectural Design & Maintenance Standards have been written with the intent of assuring homeowners that the character and appeal of the neighborhood is maintained. This in turn, protects property values and enhances the community's overall environment.

We remind homeowners & renters that any <u>architectural and/or exterior changes require an application and approval.</u> To gain approval for changes, submit an application to the Architectural Review Board (ARB) using the *Armfield Farm Homeowners Association Exterior Alterations Application* (related changes can be included on the same form).

The Armfield Farm HOA Board and Capitol Property Management are committed to ensuring that residents remain compliant with the standards set forth in the Association's Architectural Design & Maintenance Standards. If/when compliance is not followed, applicable penalties can be applied to homeowners who violate the standards.


